c) Recommendation from the Ad Hoc Committee on the Reorganization of Educational Services in the Greater Québec City Area

WHEREAS the members of the Executive Committee were presented with a revised organization model for the Greater Québec City Area;

WHEREAS the Central Québec School Board Council of Commissioners, at the December 15, 2021, Regular Council of Commissioners Meeting, approved the formation of an Ad hoc Committee to study the possibility of a reorganization of youth sector services for the greater Québec City area;

c) Recommendation from the Ad Hoc Committee on the Reorganization of Educational Services in the Greater Québec City Area (continued)

WHEREAS the Ad hoc Committee for the Greater Québec City Area was presented with a revised organization model for the Greater Québec City area and its implications;

WHEREAS the Ad hoc Committee has initiated a preliminary consultation with the governing board chairs and principals of all schools concerned in accordance with sections 40 and 79 of the Education Act;

WHEREAS under articles 40 and 79 of the Education Act, the school board may, at the request of the governing board, amend or repeal the act of establishment of a school in keeping with the three-year plan and destination of immovables;

WHEREAS a timeline was created according to section 212 of the Education Act and the Central Québec School Board Policy Concerning the Modification or Revocation of a Deed of Establishment for this process;

WHEREAS the School Board must consult all school staff concerned;

WHEREAS the School Board must consult with official employee groups;

WHEREAS the School Board must consult the municipalities concerned;

WHEREAS the School Board must consult the CQSB Parents' Committee in accordance with section 193 of the Education Act;

WHEREAS the school board must initiate a public consultation process in accordance with section 212 of the Education Act;

WHEREAS the school board must consult the parents of the schools concerned by the proposed changes;

It was MOVED by I. O'Gallagher, SECONDED by J. Kilganan and unanimously RESOLVED; THAT the Council of Commissioners mandate the Ad hoc Committee, with the support of the Administration Council, to launch a public consultation process; and

THAT the Ad hoc Committee assesses long-term plans for the youth sector of the Greater Québec City area; and

THAT the Ad hoc Committee develops the consultation process; and

THAT the Ad hoc Committee collects data from the consultation; and

THAT the Ad hoc Committee analyzes the data, modifies the plan as needed; and

THAT the Ad hoc Committee submits a final recommendation to the Council of Commissioners concerning the adoption of this proposed reorganization by December 1, 2022.

e) <u>Hiring of a General Contractor: Document Management Centre—Restoration of Entrances and Lift</u>

WHEREAS the Central Québec School Board had reserved part of the *maintien des bâtiments* budget for the restoration of the Document Management Centre entrance and installation of a new lift;

WHEREAS plans and specifications were prepared and a public call for tenders for general contractors was published on SEAO on March 9, 2022, and the envelopes were opened on March 31, 2022;

WHEREAS the architect has recommended that the lowest tender be accepted as it met the requirements and specifications of the project;

It was MOVED by I. O'Gallagher, SECONDED by D. Eden and unanimously RESOLVED; THAT the Central Québec School Board's Council of Commissioners accept the lowest tender that met the specifications for the restoration of the Document Management Centre entrance and installation of a new lift (3007, rue William Stuart, Québec, QC G1W 1V4) as submitted by *Les Entreprises QuébecHaB ltée* (564, rue de l'Argon, Québec, QC G2N 2E1), in the amount of \$472,800.00 (taxes not included); and

THAT the Director General be authorized to sign the contract on behalf of the School Board
