Our Mandate

The ABAV Committee at RRHS is dedicated to:

- Assessing the school climate by collecting and analyzing data on bullying and violence.
- Listening to staff and student feedback to understand current challenges.
- Designing and implementing proactive strategies that promote safety, inclusion, and respect.
- Creating a school environment where every student feels supported, valued, and empowered to thrive.

Key Definitions

- <u>Bullying:</u> Repeated behaviour meant to harm or exclude another person.
- <u>Discrimination</u>: Unfair treatment based on identity or personal characteristics.
- <u>Violence</u>: Words or actions that harm or threaten someone's safety or dignity.
- <u>Sexual Violence</u>: Any unwanted sexual attention, behavior or contact.
- <u>Racism</u>: Mistreatment or exclusion based on race, ethnicity or culture.

Element 1: Analysis of the Situation

The school reviews data and feedback each year to identify bullying or violence concerns and guide priorities.

Element 2: Prevention Measures

Proactive activities and discussions promote kindness, respect and inclusion. All forms of bullying, discrimination and violence are addressed.

Element 3: Measures for Parents or Guardians

Parents are encouraged to:

- Talk with their children about respect and empathy.
- Report concerns to school staff.
- Stay informed through school communication.





Element 4: Reporting

Anyone can report bullying or violence verbally or in writing to school staff or through the QR code. Reports should be made as soon as possible.

Element 5: Intervention Protocol

Staff respond promptly, gather facts, and take fair action to support those involved.

Element 6: Respect and Confidentiality

All reports are handled privately and securely, respecting everyone's confidentiality

Element 7: Supervisory and Support Measures

Support is offered to victims, witnesses, and those who bully, helping student stake responsibility and build empathy.

Element 8: Disciplinary Actions

Consequences depend on the situation and aim to ensure safety, learning, and accountability.
