Evaluation of Learning

The student's progress is expressed in a form of a percentage in each subject area. A class average is also generated. The report card includes a section for general teacher comments for each subject. The comments will describe your child's strengths, challenges and progress. The evaluation of student learning will be assessed on a regular basis, through different means such as in-class work, learning and evaluation situations, assignments, tests, student portfolios, observations, performance, etc.

It is important to note that students are expected to be in school on the day of regular class evaluations throughout the school year. Students who do not come to school must provide a doctor's note justifying the absence in order to be permitted to do the evaluation at another time pre-determined by the teacher.

Secondary students will have a mid-year exam session from January 22, 2018 to January 25, 2018. Many of these exams will begin during regular class time one week prior to the exam period so it is important that all students be at school for this evaluation session as term 2 marks will reflect the results of these evaluations.

It is important to note that students are expected to be at school for the entire month of May as evaluations take place throughout the entire month. These evaluations are important, require student participation on a daily basis, and are part of the year-end mark. The school cannot provide for evaluations outside this time-frame.

* Final exams in Secondary, whether locally developed or prescribed by the CQSB, are worth 20% of the final mark. Uniform examinations issued by the MEES are worth 50% of the final mark in Secondary 4 and 5. All final exams will follow the schedule dictated by the MEES and begin in May. All local and CQSB exams will take place in the last three weeks of June.

Absence from exams without proper justification will result in a mark of 0 for the exam missed. A justified absence may be authorized for the following reasons:

- Serious illness or accident confirmed by a medical report or certificate;
- Death of a close relative:
